#### Coins in early Hong Kong: 1981 one-thousand-dollar Year of the Rooster commemorative gold coin

The cover picture shows the one-thousand-dollar commemorative gold coin issued by the Hong Kong Government in 1981, the Year of the Rooster. The Rooster, which is also the Chinese Zodiac Animal for 2005, symbolises confidence, trustworthiness and loyalty.

Between 1976 and 1987 the Hong Kong Government issued a series of commemorative gold coin celebrating the Twelve Animals of the Chinese Zodiac. The number of gold coins issued in each year fluctuated according to market demand, which was also reflected in the issue price.

Each commemorative gold coin weighs about 16 grams. It has a diameter of 28.4 millimetres, and it is 1.8 millimetres thick. In 1981 one thousand dollars could buy one square foot in a typical above-average residential flat. Today it can buy about twenty square inches in the same kind of flat.
