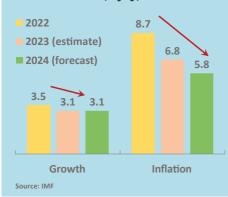
Highlights

- Global monetary tightening slows economic growth as inflation eases
- Uncertainties from the pace of US rate cuts, global growth prospects, and geopolitical tensions

Global GDP growth and inflation (%yoy)

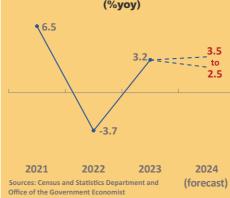


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Domestic Economy

- The Hong Kong economy recovered further in 2H 2023 led by tourism and consumption
- Economic recovery to continue at a moderate pace in 2024 amid further recovery of tourism and stabilisation of goods export

Property Markets

- Housing market remained soft, despite showing some signs of stabilisation after the relaxation of policy measures
- Commercial real estate, especially offices, faced high vacancy amid external uncertainties

Housing prices and transaction volume

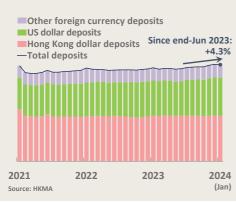




Monetary Environment and Interest Rates

- HKD interest rates remain high, posing downward pressures on economy and asset markets
- Total deposits increased by 4.3% since end-June 2023, reflecting investor confidence in Hong Kong

Deposits with authorized institutions by currency (HKD)

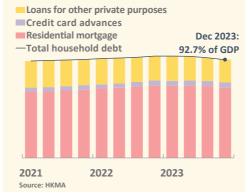


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Credit Risk -Household Debt

 Hong Kong's households remained financially sound, and the household debt-to-GDP ratio edged down by 3.2 percentage points to 92.7% in 2H 2023

Banking Sector Performance

- The banking sector remained safe and well capitalised
- Asset quality stayed healthy despite challenges arising from uncertainties over the US monetary policy, global growth prospects and geopolitical tensions
